



White Cloud, Kansas native Meredith J. "Jeanie" Idol, 69, of St. Joseph, MO, died peacefully at her home surrounded by her family, Sunday evening, April 3, 2016.

Jeanie, as she was known by family and friends, was born at White Cloud, July 6, 1946, one of six children born to Henry Eugene "Bean" and Doris Collins Waggoner and spent her growing up years at White Cloud where she attended grade school, later graduating from Highland High School with the class of 1964. Jeanie received her associate's degree in business at Highland Junior College, two years later. She worked as a clerk at the Bank of White Cloud, Doniphan County at the Courthouse, and at Highland College. She worked many years at the Veterans Administration Hospital in Leavenworth, retiring about 10 years ago.

She married Jerry Idol, June 18, 1966, at the Fanning Church. Due to Jerry's serving with the military, they moved around a lot including several years spent at Bean Lake near Rushville, MO, prior to making St. Joseph their home about 15 years ago. He survives.

Jeanie was preceded in death by her parents; and a brother Richard Waggoner.
