Helen Ukena Ruch, 96, of Leona, died Monday night, September 19, 2016, at Hiawatha Community Hospital.

She led a full and rich life. Helen was born June 10, 1920, at the family home across the road from the church. She was the youngest of three daughters of John and Elizabeth Ukena, and lived near or in Leona her entire life. She attended Bellevue Country School, Leona High School, and Highland Community College. She worked for many years at the Farmers Bank of Leona and later at the post office in Leona.

Helen was a lifelong member of Bellevue United Methodist Church. The church and music were vital parts of her life. She was the church secretary for many years, sang in the choir, and was the pianist for the Bellevue Men's Quartet. She was very involved in the community as well.
