It was several years ago that Raymond was introduced to Dirt Track Racing when his brother-in-law allowed him his first drive in the “Green Weenie”. From that moment, dirt tracking racing became his passion. He purchased his son and himself race cars, and from there, he never looked back. In his racing career, Raymond earned a first-place finish and several top placements. He loved his racing family. Through it all, Raymond was known for his quiet calmness, compassion and determination to finish the job. He was a family man. He loved his three children more than anything and was proud of their accomplishments no matter how big or small. He enjoyed spending time with them, riding 4-wheelers, shooting guns, working on cars and watching all their athletic events and dancing routines. He was the steady in his family and had an incredible ability to weather any storm.
