Louis T Siebenmorgen, 83, of rural Hiawatha passed away at Maple Heights Nursing Home in Hiawatha May 31, 2018.

Louis was born February 3, 1935, near Hiawatha, KS one of five children of the late Louis G. and Alma Wasserfallen Siebenmorgen and had lived nearly all of his life in Northeast Kansas. He grew up in Powhattan area, graduating from Powhattan High School. He farmed in the Mercier/Powhattan area and drove the bus for USD 430 for several years. Louie served with the 2 BN, 130th FA, Kansas Army National Guard for a total of six years. He later moved his family to the Robinson/White Cloud area to farm for Bryan Farms until retirement.
