Gloria June Wilkers (Lowdermik) Snyder died Wednesday, August 8, 2018 at the Vintage Park Assisted Living Facility in Holton.

For over twenty years she spent the winters in Arizona with her two daughters and grandchildren. Not only did she enjoy the warm weather, she spent precious time with Heidi and Carlie teaching them how to cook and sew, helping with Girl Scouts, driving them to dance and watching them perform. Always the beloved Grammy that would sneak cookies and candy when Mom wasn't looking!

She was preceded in death by her husband Vernon in 1999, her brother Calvin Wilkers and her sister Rosemary Wilkers Hardy.
