He was a past president of the Kansas Livestock Association. He attended Christ the King Catholic Church in Topeka, and was a 40 year member of Knight of Columbus Council 6671 at Valley Falls

Doc Joe's hobbies included classic car restoration and making fudge for area fundraisers. He married Denise Eskridge Dec. 30, 1972 in Richardson, TX. They divorced.

Survivors include his two sons, Bodahn (Christy) Kobuszewski, Richardson, TX, and Gates (Jamie) Kobuszewski, Virginia Beach, Virginia; his mother, Regina C. Kobuszewski, Hanover; his companion, Debby McCormack, Topeka; his brother, Dr. Michael (Carol) Kobuszewski, DVM, Topeka; his four sisters, Carolyn (David) Lickteig, and Captain Anita Kobuszewski USN (Ret.), all of Hanover, Jeanne Kobuszewski, Sheboygan, WI, and Patricia (Dennis) Greenhaw, Lawrence; four grandchildren; Christian, Presley, William, and Maverick, and many nephews and nieces.
