William (Bill) M. Gleason, 93, of Seneca, KS passed away peacefully, of natural causes, on Thursday, December 6, 2018 at the Nemaha Valley Community Hospital in Seneca.

Bill was born on February 2,1925 in Goff, KS to William Gleason Sr and Sarah (Jones) Gleason, who both preceded him in death. Bill grew up in Goff community; attending and graduating from Goff High School. As a young man, he helped his father at family car dealership.

Bill was a veteran of World War II, at the age of 18 Bill joined the United States Navy. He served his country and attained the rank of Aviation Cadet V-5; he was discharged on June 30, 1947. Bill returned to Nemaha County and continued the Chevrolet car dealership, owning Gleason Chevrolet for over 40 years.
