After his health started to decline, and he was no longer able to do the welding, he closed his shop and went to work for Sac & Fox Casino for 5 years, before retiring. Leon was a tinkerer at making and creating many items from sight—spinn—spinn—ing flowers, weather vanes, grabbers, and so forth as, there are too many to mention. To put it plain and simple, he just liked to work.

Leon married Barbara L. "Bobbie" Stallbaumer on July 3, 1965 at St. Patrick's Catholic Church in Corning. The couple celebrated 50 years of marriage, in 2015.

Leon was a member of Sts. Peter & Paul Catholic Church in Seneca. He was a dedicated husband, son, father, brother, and grandfather.

Leon was very devoted to the church, where he was an usher for the Sunday morning Mass. He also made all of the seating for the annual Labor Day church picnic. Leon was always lending a helpful hand. Leon took pleasure in camping, hunting, being outdoors and all activities with his family.

He was preceded in death by his wife Bobbie on August 9, 2015; his daughter, Tracy Ann Osterhaus on September 5, 1970; his mother, Elizabeth on May 19, 2000; and a brother, Elmer on November 7, 2008.
