Roger attended Kelly High School and graduated in 1955. After graduation, Roger joined the Kansas Army National Guard and was a member for ten years from 1955 to 1966. Roger was a dedicated farmer and cattleman who loved his work. Roger- faithful companions through the years on the farm were his beloved dogs who accompanied him wherever he went.

Roger had many other interests besides farming and cattle. He enjoyed gardening and canning his own produce. Roger also tried his hand at baking pies. Roger took great pride in having a well-manicured yard. His favorite hobby was hunting pheasant and quail with his brother, Kenny and his nephew, Kenny, Jr., and this brought him so much joy. Roger worked for the Nemaha County Soil Conservation Department during the summer months. In 1964, he started working at the Goodyear Tire & Rubber Company Plant in Topeka, Kansas where he worked for 30 years before retiring in 1994. In addition to these work commitments, Roger cared for and had a close relationship with his father, Frank, until his death. He also cared for his brother, Frankie, after he was injured in an automobile accident until his death earlier this year.

Roger married Joan E. (Miller) Manning on May 5, 1995, at the St. Bede- Catholic Church in Kelly, and they shared 28 wonderful years of marriage.
