London struggled most of his short life with an unknown condition that robbed him eventually of his hearing, his vision, and ultimately his life on earth.

London attended Hiawatha schools most of his life. He graduated from Kansas School for the Deaf in Olathe, KS in May 2012 where he had attended his Junior and Senior year.

London wanted to be a marine biologist or a veterinarian. He loved his dog KOKO, movie nights with his cousins, reading a good book, listening to Christian music, and encouraging others on Facebook. He led a life that let Jesus shine for others to see.

Survived by his parents and brother Isaiah of the home, a sister Kizzi of Leavenworth, KS; step-sister Rachael Boone; step-brothers Jamil and Demetrius Boone, all of St. Joseph, MO; his birth father Dwaine Day of Denver, CO; grand-parents: Stan and Sheila Koelliker of Horton, KS, Ralph and Norma Jean Harris of St. Joseph, MO, grandmother in love Adella Bierbaun, great-grandmother Dorothy Brook of Horton, KS; numerous uncles, aunts, cousins, and a host of friends.
