For the first time this year the Remington Nature Center in Saint Joseph, Missouri wild be displaying Junior Duck stamp winners from April 26- May 27. The Remington Nature Center has daily hour of operation from 10 a-m till 5 p-m.

Squaw Creek National Wildlife Refuge will be displaying duplicate prints from April 22- May 26. Visitors wishing to view top winner's artwork from the 2013 Missouri contest at the refuge can visit the headquarters office weekdays from 7:30 a-m to 4 p-m or weekends 10 a-m to 4 p-m through May 26th.

The Fish and Wildlife Service's Federal Duck Stamp Office makes the national winner's stamp available for \$5.00. Proceeds from the Junior Duck Stamp sales are used to support environmental education efforts and awards for contest winners. The program is nationally coordinated by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service in Arlington, VA. The Junior Duck Stamp Program has many benefits. It introduces school-age children to the natural world. It instills a sense of individual responsibility in the maintenance of our environment. The program benefits waterfowl and their habitats as well as all migratory birds and hundreds of plants and animals that share wetland habitats.
