FFA Land Judging Teams Qualify for State Competition

The individual winner was Zach Roath of Palmyra with a score of 337 points.

Blue ribbon recipients included Jessica Bohling of JCC, and Hayden Meyer, Clayton Branek, and Collin Moser of Pawnee City.
