Highway Signs To Honor Fallen Officer

She suggested southbound highway seven at the K-20 junction as the ideal place, but warned that they do have to have a sign at both ends of the highway. She says that she really wants it to be highways seven that is dedicated to Enzbrenner, because it is the one he drove on the most often.

City manager Trey Cocking will be meeting with state representative Jerry Henry on this project, and will come back to the commission with more information in the near future.
