New Hiawatha City Administrator Sworn In

And the commission authorized the mayor and city clerk to sign the first of four easements needed for the Hiawatha Fitness and School Trail project.

Engineer Brian Kingsley with BG Consultants says plans are to put the project out for bid early next year, with construction taking place in the summer after school is out. The city has been awarded grants totaling more than \$1.2 million from the Federal Highway Administration and Kansas Department of Transportation to help fund the project.
