Democratic Candidates Meet And Greet Set in Atchison

Kotich, Kansas Insurance Commissioner candidate Dennis Anderson, Jean Schodorf, candidate for Kansas Secretary of State, candidate for Kansas House of Representatives Steve Lukert, State Representative Jerry Henry, Charlie Purdue, candidate for Atchison County Commission, and Chad Taylor; who will be running against fellow Democrat Patrick Wiesner for a seat in the United States Senate in the August 5th Primary election. Wiesner also plans to attend, along with Tom Burroughs, who will be representing gubernatorial candidate Paul Davis.

The event is free, and open to the public. Refreshments will be available, and those planning to attend are encouraged to bring a lawn chair.
