For those familiar with Terry, they would immediately recognize him as an outdoorsman, big-game hunter, and conservationist at heart. In fact, he was quite proud of his trophy room.

Terry was also passionate about his home and his community, serving on the State Bank of Bern Board of Directors for 34 years. He also served on the church council of Friedens United

Church of Christ, where he was a lifelong member.

He was an avid reader of safari, hunting, and aviation publications with an extensive home library. As a lover of animals and wildlife, a dog was never far from his side. He will be dearly missed by his current dog, Zip.

Terry was preceded in death by his parents, Hank (May 20, 1980) and Vada (December 24, 2009), and wife Dana of 42 years (February 3, 2001).
