Dixie Marie (Nickell) Bontrager, 87 of Whiting, KS, passed away on Thursday, February 24, 2022 at home surrounded by her family. She was born August 16, 1934 in Wetmore, KS, the daughter of Ross R. "Dick" and Velma L. (Mayer) Nickell.

Dixie attended a one-room school house, Pea Ridge School, from 1st through 6th grade and graduated from Wetmore High School in 1952.
