Michael J. Green, 79, Everest, Kansas, died Thursday, March 7, 2024, at the University of Kansas Medical Center in Kansas City, Kansas.

Mike had a passion for cars, including classic cars, attending drag races and in his younger years was a great mechanic. He was a fan of the Chiefs, Royals and Kansas Jayhawks. Mike loved his family and always enjoyed spoiling his nieces and nephews.
