Four Kanzaland Athletes & One Coach Participate in Shrine Bowl

The annual Kansas Shrine Bowl took place in Emporia at Welch stadium on the campus of Emporia State University this weekend and four Kanzaland area athletes and one area coach participated in the game for the east squad.
