Thursday is Winter Weather Awareness Day

Parts of western Nebraska got a fluke snowstorm a few weeks ago, and Johnson says the time to prepare for the winter season is now. (play audio :21 "website of course.")

Some of those items should include blankets, a flashlight, extra batteries, a radio, a shovel, and non-perishable food.

After this year's prolonged drought, everyone's wondering about the severity of the winter ahead. Johnson says predictions are still inconclusive for the upcoming season. (play audio :17 "nothing significant.")
