October Unemployment Rates for Southeast Nebraska

(KLZA) Nebraska's unemployment rate for October dipped to 3.8 percent, down from 3.9 percent in September and 4.4 percent a year earlier.

In extreme Southeast Nebraska the rates were mixed. Richardson and Nemaha Counties had October unemployment rates of 4.5 percent which is down a tenth of a point in Richardson County and down two tenths in Nemaha County.

In Pawnee and Johnson counties the rate climbed 3 tenths to 2.8 percent in Pawnee County and 3.7 percent in Johnson County. Gage County was up a tenth to 4.3 percent and Otoe County was steady at 3.6 percent.
