Falls City Council Expected to Act on Utility Rate Study Monday Night (KLZA) Two meetings are planned for the Falls City Council Monday. The first meeting will begin at 5 p-m in the Council Chambers to allow the Council to hear the results of a utility rate study presented by John Krajewski.

During the regular meeting beginning at 7 p-m the Council is expected to take action on the first reading of ordinances on rates, fees and charges for the Electric, Gas, Sewer and Water Departments.
