Kansas To Receive 100,000 Masks from Taiwan

U.S. Senator Jerry Moran (R-Kan.) today <u>announced</u> that Kansas will receive 100,000 surgical masks from Taiwan. After a request from Sen. Moran's staff, Taiwan designated 100,000 masks for Kansas as part of its <u>third round of international aid</u> to countries impacted by COVID-19.
