Charlie Spoonhour Dies Charlie Spoonhour _ the former coach at Missouri State, St. Louis and UNLV has died. He was 72.

Chuck Harker, the funeral director at Walker's Funeral Home in Chapel Hill, says Spoonhour died Wednesday.

Spoonhour was a popular coach known for his homespun humor and oncourt success. He was diagnosed in 2010 with a lung disease called idiopathic pulmonary fibrosis, which required a transplant at Duke University Medical Center.

Spoonhour spent nine seasons at Missouri State, then known as Southwest Missouri State, and went 197-81 with five NCAA tournament appearances.

He left for St. Louis in 1992, compiling a 122-90 record in seven seasons with three NCAA appearances.

He retired briefly then returned to coaching at UNLV, going 54-31 in three seasons. He retired following the 2003-04 season.

Spoonhour, a Mulberry, Kansas native served three seasons as an assistant coach at Nebraska in the early 80's under Moe Iba.
